Alternately you can grab one of the wrapped shoe boxes in that same area or on the back of the last pew in the sanctuary. You could also make a financial contribution and we would be happy to shop for you. Also, we are still in need of shoe boxes we can wrap in colorful paper to fill for needy children around the

world. Men's shoe boxes, ladies boot boxes and athletic shoe boxes are the perfect size for this mission project.

Blessing Box - We are still collecting non-perishable food items to stock our blessing box to provide food for local families with food insecurity.
