Building Fund- In 2018, Shiloh took out a mortgage loan of \$400,000 for the construction of the addition which included the music room, elevator, 3 classrooms, additional rest rooms, and new entrance. Since 2018, substantial progress has been made in reducing the mortgage through designated donations, fundraisers, and memorials. At the present time, the mortgage balance is now \$37,771.37. Your continued support in your giving and participation in our fundraising will help us eliminate that mortgage in the near future.
